***⁶Sacrifice and offering you do not desire,
but you have given me an open ear.***

***Burnt offering and sin offering
you have not required.***

***⁷Then I said, "Here I am;

your law is within my heart."***

Psalm 40:6-8

This morning, I read these wise words from the extraordinary preacher, Barbara Brown Taylor, speaking about why she listens to sermons:

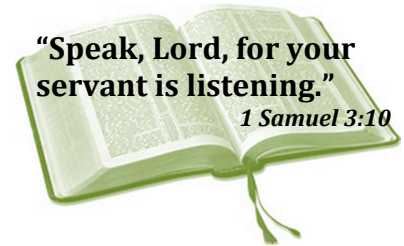
I listen because I seek something: a sense of connection, a handle on mystery, an invitation to wonder. I listen because I hope to hear my own life described, my own fears addressed, and my own hopes fed. I listen for the same reason we all listen: to see if we can find God in the words and events that come our way each day.

She goes on with this advice to preachers:

A good preacher must first of all be a good listener. In the same way that a child listens before learning to speak, a preacher cannot proclaim the word of God before listening to that word and wrestling with it until it has yielded its blessing. Only then does one dare to speak, building a fragile bridge of words between the ancient stories of faith, and the everyday stories of people's lives.

It seems to me that BBT, as we affectionately called her in seminary, is saying something about being attentive to the way God spoke way back in Bible times and the way that God is speaking to us today, and the intersection of those two things. I believe that is the work not only of the preacher, but of the whole church: to listen to God's word in Scripture, and to God's word revealed in our own lives, in our community and our world, and to build the bridge between the two, so that we can "find God in the words and events that come our way each day."

And so, I am trying to listen, to God who speaks through the ancient text *and* God who is speaking to us now. And I am glad when you tell me how God is speaking to you. This listening seems especially important for Westminster right now as we seek God’s direction for our personal lives of discipleship, and for the mission and vision of our church. How has God been at work in the past, and how is God at work among us now? How is God who is faithful, remaining faithful to Westminster and through Westminster? How is God, who makes all things new, working a new thing at Westminster? And how is God calling you to be part of Westminster’s sturdy foundation and her new growth?



Another wise theologian, Karl Barth, advised preachers to preach with the Bible in one hand, and the newspaper in another. Holding this newsletter in one hand along with whatever you use to stay abreast of the news of the world, and the word of God in another, I hope you will listen for God’s word to you, and God’s word to our church in this time and this place.

According to the PC(USA) *Book of Order 2017-2019*, “Ordered ministries are gifts to the church to order its life so that the ministry of the whole people of God may flourish. ... Ordination to the ministry of deacon, ruling elder, or minister of the Word and Sacrament (also called teaching elder) is unique to that order of ministry.

“As there were in Old Testament times elders for the government of the

people, so the New Testament church provided persons with particular gifts to share in discernment of God’s Spirit and governance of God’s people. Accordingly, congregations should elect persons of wisdom and maturity of faith, having demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit.

“Ruling elders are so named not because they ‘lord it over’ the congregation (Matt. 20:25), but because they are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life. ...”



The service did, as the Book of Order admonishes, “... focus upon Christ and the joy and responsibility of serving him through the mission and ministry of the church.”

Greenwood Place Update

God provides! After navigating some choppy financial waters at the end of 2019, Greenwood Place starts 2020 with smoother sailing. Over the last four months, Greenwood Place has been fortunate to raise a total of \$98,770. In the month of December alone, Greenwood Place received donations that totaled \$10,520.

Of that amount, \$7,500 came from First Presbyterian Church's Endowment Fund. These funds are designated to support our process to become accredited by Clubhouse International. That accreditation then opens the door to Greenwood Place being reimbursed by Medicaid for therapeutic services. That would provide a substantial, stable footing for our program.

The Greenwood Place Board of Directors recently approved the Clubhouse going to a 5-day week, as required by Medicaid. Westminster provided Greenwood Place with an amended Facilities Use Agreement that allows Greenwood Place to be open for use this 5th day. Our first full week to be open was the week of January 18th.

To ensure ongoing financial stability, Greenwood Place is pursuing multiple revenue streams, such as:

- Request for inclusion in the 2020 – 2021 State of South Carolina Mental Health Budget
- Grant submitted to the Greenwood County Community Foundation for bus repairs
- Application for inclusion in United Ways 2020 funding
- Potential grant from PC(USA)'s Presbyterian Mental Health Ministry Grant Program, in partnership with Westminster

In summary, we begin 2020 with a successful, beneficial program in full swing, and optimism for a long, healthy future!



Seeking Input on WPC's Mental Health Ministry

Partly as an outgrowth of the "Blessed are the Crazy" presentation by author Sarah Griffin Lund, a group of interested individuals at Connie Maxwell Children's Home recently convened a networking session to explore ways to destigmatize youth mental health issues. A representative from the Greenville NAMI organization provided information about their program targeting middle- and high-school-aged students, as well as one for their teachers and one for families.

This program, "Ending the Silence," provides simple but powerful tools for recognizing and helping individuals who may need support. There is growing support for bringing this program to our local schools. But, there aren't plans as yet for offering it to families. It might also be helpful to extend to pastors and church staff the training targeting educators.

What is *Lent*?

Is a season of 40 days, beginning with Ash Wednesday (February 26 this year) and ending on the Saturday before Easter (April 11, 2020).¹ Just as Advent is a season of waiting and preparation for the coming of Christ, Lent is a season of waiting and preparing for the new life we have come to know in Christ, a life of intimate connection with God and neighbor, empowered by the Holy Spirit.

Biblically, 40 is a number that signifies transformation. Through prayer and




devotional practices, we hope to grow through these 40 days. Plan to join us at Westminster as we begin the Lenten Season together with our Ash Wednesday service on Feb. 26.

¹ Did you do the math? Why are there more than 40 days between those two dates? Because each Sunday is a little Easter!

Count all the days except the Sundays, and you should come up with 40. Many people commit to a discipline during the 40 days of Lent, like the discipline of doing a small kindness every day, or the discipline of dedicating a period of time each day to prayer, or the discipline of giving up something that may stand in the way of your commitment to loving God and neighbor, like television or chocolate.

What will you do in these 40 days to open yourself up to the way that God is shaping you for a resurrected life? These days ahead of Lent are a good time to listen and discern your Lenten practice.
